Welcome Back!

Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been great to see the children back at school and they have settled in really quickly! There is always a lot going on this term. We have added some dates already, but will aim to inform you of dates up to Christmas very shortly.

School Day

School starts at 8.45am. The door is open for children to come into school from 8.35am onwards and the gate will be shut at 8.45am.

School finishes at 3.15pm. This year we will try taking Class 1 out onto the yard to see if this makes picking up run more smoothly. We'll start that from Monday.

Class 2

On Mondays Mrs Pawlitta is not in class. This year Mondays will run slightly differently. The children will receive music lessons from Derbyshire Schools Music Partnership first lesson.

After morning break and in the afternoon the class will be taught maths, science and forest schools in small groups. Mrs Chilton will teach Science, Mrs Redgate will teach Maths and Mr Jenner-Dyer will teach Forest Schools. The typical day will look like this:

Class 1 Phonics Workshops

Safeguarding

Our number one priority in school is keeping everyone safe, both emotionally and physically. If you have any concerns about your child or any other, please bring them to the attention of the school Designated Safeguarding Lead, Mr Robson, or to Mrs Pawlitta, who is the Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead.

Based on our conversation we will then decide an appropriate course of action to help support a child at risk and their family.

You can also directly contact Starting Point, which is the centralised referral point for safeguarding concerns in Derbyshire, or, if someone is in immediate danger, contact the police.

Again though, if the concern is urgent and you require immediate help, you should contact **Starting Point** on **01629 533190** or the Police.

During the year, we will be undertake work with the children to promote their safety and well-being. We follow the Derbyshire approved syllabus for PSHE which covers a wide range of safeguarding issues.

We will also be learning how to keep safe online, something that is vitally important in this day and age. This will be covered in computing lessons and also during our day-to-day teaching.

Safeguarding information is posted on our notice board, on the school website and we may send out other relevant information on Class Dojo.
